

LEGEND.

Headscroll in paint and gold leaf bearing the word FAWKHAM supported on the left by oak leaves and on the right by seven acorns indicating our inclusion in the District of Sevenoaks.

On the left hand panel the De Faukham coat of arms.

On the right hand panel the White Horse of Kent on red background indicating our inclusion in the County of Kent.

The two panels divided by a vertical green line hatched in white - representing the Green Belt.

sited at Baldwin's Green at the Junction with Castle Hill and Valley Road within the Parish of Fawkham.

Construction.

Superimposed upon a block of concrete aggregate 2'6" X 2'6" X 9" sunk in natural soil - Metal fixing base to take 6" X 6" X 6' English Oak Post securely bolted with rag bolts to concrete base.

with 3 step rustic brick surround covering base

and enclosing base of post. The top of post to be Mitred or pointed for water shedding.

Artist's Heraldic Sign to swing on chain links.

within 28" X 28" Strap Iron Frame, ornamented and fitted with a large "S" Scroll on each Side and two smaller "s" Scrolls supporting trefoil finial at top of frame.

Finish

Engraved or cast plate of inscription in Brass or Aluminium or suitable non ferrous alternative.

The English Oak six inch post to be treated with linseed oil.

N.B. the blue wavy line on a silver background is a pun on the watercourse which flows down Valley Road!

The latin inscription Regnat Populus :-

Let the People Rule.
